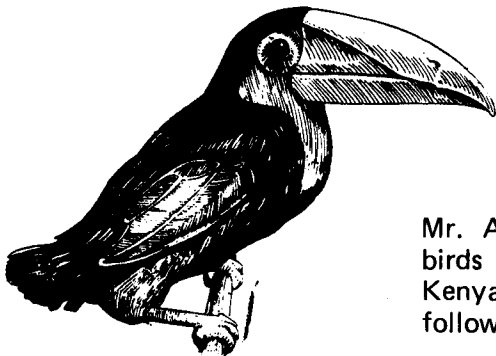
You will be put on a mailing list and contacted when it is official, probably next spring. You need not be a Nassau resident.

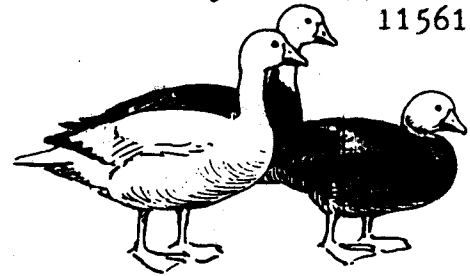
